From the West

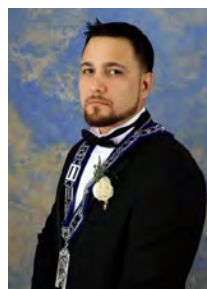


Hello Brothers,
